Maggie has had opportunity to observe and treat children of various ages and levels of disability. She asks questions appropriately to gain increased understanding of positioning and handling techniques. She has been provided with instruction in the use of dynamic equipment such as therapy balls, bolsters, scooters, and swings. She has shown increased animation, flexibility, and creativity during her attempts to engage the patients in treatment activities over the past several weeks. She has shown improvements in her ability to document treatment notes to reflect skilled intervention. A goal for Maggie is to gain increased clinical skills to better serve infants and children with neurological impairments. Goals for Maggie are to implement behavioral modification techniques and strategies to promote improved sensory modulation in children with autism. An additional goal for Maggie is to increase her competence in handling techniques the use of dynamic equipment prior to the end of her FW.

COMMENT

Maggie has shown improvements in her clinical skills since midterm. She has shown increased confidence in her ability to treat children of different ages and levels of impairment. She has shown increased variety and creativity in her treatment activities. She has improved her ability to incorporate use of dynamic surfaces into her treatment approach as needed. She has demonstrated techniques to promote improved sensory modulation in children. She has demonstrated improved ability to implement behavioral modification techniques. Her documentation of skilled intervention meets chart review requirements. Maggie's positioning and handling techniques of individuals with neurological impairments have improved, but continue to be an area of growth for Maggie.
